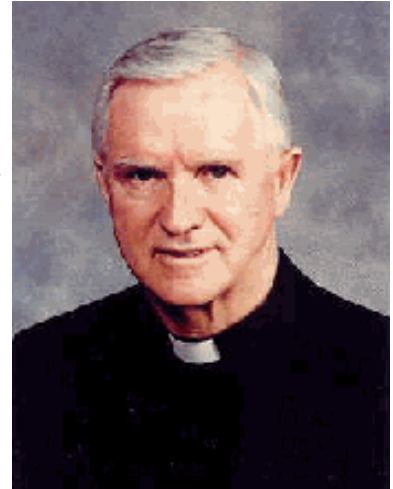

## Chaplin's Message

Dear Fellow Knights:

As you are no doubt aware, Bishop Henry has been quite strong and eloquent in defending the traditional definition of marriage. I would like to quote a couple of paragraphs from a recent article he wrote for the Calgary Sun:

“Clearly marriage has important religious meaning. But it also has enormous social importance and significance because of its pivotal role in the procreation of children and the nurturing of future generations. Likewise, the anthropological, personal, religious and social dimensions of marriage are deeply rooted in history and culture.



Marriage is a human reality, a natural institution that precedes all social, legal and religious systems. Marriage predates our present government or any other, and predates, as well, the founding of the Church. Marriage is not the creature of the State or Church, and neither a government nor the Church has the authority to change its nature. This form of life for couples has always been valued and protected as an institution because of its unique character, its way of ordering human relationships, and its procreative potential.

Invoking the principles of equity, equality, autonomy and freedom of choice, the government, in its draft legislation, proposes to remove the distinctions between heterosexual spouses and same-sex partners in order to give the latter access to normative marital status. This confuses equality with uniformity; it requires respect for diversity and difference. Society should value diversity. It is not discriminatory to treat different realities differently.”

Bishop Henry challenges the rather facile and superficial argumentation that is often put forward to change the definition of marriage. Hopefully, his efforts will help in this very disturbing and controversial matter.

**The following is a review of our Council's activities for the second half of 2002 – 2003 Columbian year. (January – June)**

**Community Activities:** In May we had another successful **Church BBQ** with 145 folks attending. **Two pancake breakfasts** were held, the first on February 12<sup>th</sup>, and the second, April 27<sup>th</sup>. The April event had poorer attendance and fewer volunteers. Twenty walkers showed up for **Hike for Life**. Ten of those also attended the first ever post-walk breakfast at our parish hall put on by the CWL. The second annual **Children's colouring** contest was a huge success on February 2<sup>nd</sup>. **The Bishop's cup** was held February 17<sup>th</sup> and was a tremendous success. The fourth degree honor guard provided much pomp and pageantry to this first time event

**Council Activities:** I will probably miss something here but here goes... The midterm **audit** was held in January

and everything was in order. **The World's Largest Garage Sale** produced around \$3,300.00 in net profits. We needed many more Brothers to help with the clean up though. There were precious few hands to clean up the mess and some Brothers who signed up for clean up did not show. **Brothers Michael Kelly and Dave Fischer** attended the **State Convention** in Edmonton - storm of the century or not. Brothers Leo, Willis and Joe also attended. **Council Appreciation Night** on June 20<sup>th</sup> was very poorly attended. Armand must have made over a dozen trips. **Congratulations again to Brother Greg Fisher** for his worthy award of **State Knight of the Year**. Council submitted all there necessary Serge reports. Last, but certainly not least, a **huge thank you to Brother Pierre Roy** for the tremendous and simply tireless service he provided our Council. Pierre, your service to our community and Council was a sight to behold. I only hope we can provide half the service you did last year. I appreciate the counsel you have provided me with already and it was an honor serving as your DGK.

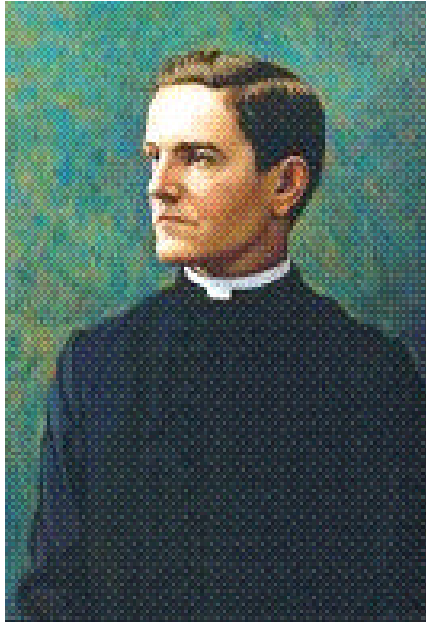
