## Marks of the True Christian

**“Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.**

**Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, ‘Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.’ No, ‘if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.’ Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.”**

Romans 12:9-21 (NRSV)

The message of Paul to the Romans should guide us in living out the fullness of our brotherhood in Christ in the Knights of Columbus.

As followers of Christ, we are all called to conversion, a conversion to a new heart and a new way of thinking. It calls us to abandon our old selves and our old ways of thinking in order to adopt a new way of being in Christ. There is an unending chain of finger-pointing, and there isn't much of self-reflection. You might think that we could not be guilty of these things, but sad to say, we are sometimes still caught in these cycles of oppression to whatever degree.

But the way of Christ is that of the Kingdom of God. In the Kingdom, one breaks free from these cycles of oppression. One is called to break free from this chain of finger-pointing and is called to be responsible for one's actions. One is called to genuine freedom in the love of God.

In a Christian community, there is dialogue and true reconciliation as they see each other as equals. One does not project one's

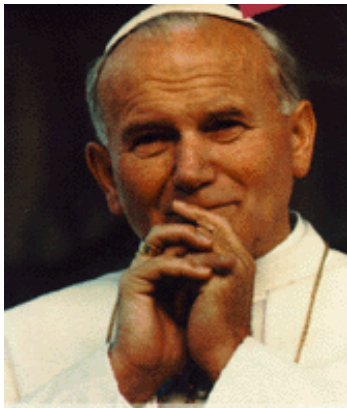
As a Christian community of brothers and sisters, you and your families are called to this love for one another, but you are also being challenged by the values of a broken world.

## St. Bonaventure Parish Council Planning “Parish Survey”

On May 27, 2003 a group of Brother Knights: **Peter Franco, Michael Hendricks, Michael Kelly, Ray Martin, Joseph Miller, George Pinckney, Mark Richards, Pierre Roy, Jay Seneviratne and Brian Trafford** prepared a series of recommendations for presentation at the June 17, 2003 Parish Council planning session. Thank you to Brother George Pinckney for having presented to the planning session the following recommendations on behalf of our council:

+ **Welcoming Program:** Personally engaging more parishioners in parish life by establishing a welcome program for new parishioners and “Greeters” at all masses. Includes **Parish Contact Booklet:** Building and maintaining a booklet of Catholic groups active in the parish including contact information.

+ **Retreat & Mission Program:** Develop a Parish Mission/Retreat program and increasing awareness of retreats offered by other Calgary Parishes or Catholic organizations. Retreats are short-term in nature—perhaps a day or weekend, while missions may take place over a longer period of time.

+ **Recognition of Sacraments:** Recognize events such as parishioner weddings, anniversaries, baptisms, first communions, confirmations etc. on a church foyer bulletin board, to reinforce Christian and family values.

+ **Social Justice Programs:** Expand support for social justice programs, such as Inn from the Cold & Mission Mexico.

+ **New Volunteers:** Need to recruit new volunteers (“new blood”, our youth). Healthy to have new ideas and build on knowledge of others. Then can support resource dependent initiatives such as Communion in both kinds. Need to recognize contribution of those who have served for a long time.

+ **Spice up the music:** Increase involvement, energy and participation of congregation in music and singing.

+ **More Reconciliation Services:** Offer one or two more reconciliation services throughout the year and educate parishioners as to the importance of the sacrament.

+ **Special Prayers:** Increase emphasis on special prayers for vocations, families, marriages, etc.
