April 2005 Meeting

The Dignity of the Eucharistic Celebration

Opening Prayer

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Reading

(to be read by the leader)

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, "The Teacher asks, Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there.' So the disciples set out and went to the city, and found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

When it was evening, he came with the twelve. And when they had taken their places and were eating, Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me.' They began to be distressed and to say to him one after another, 'Surely, not I?' He said to them, 'It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread into the bowl with me. For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that one by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that one not to have been born.'

While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.' When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. (Mark 14:12-26)

The Reflection

(to be read by the leader)

Some of you might have taken part in a Seder which is the Jewish meal to celebrate their redemption from the slavery of Egypt and the expectation of the messianic liberation. This Seder as celebrated at the time of Christ was probably the liturgical outline for the Last Supper. The Gospel reading showed us in the first part the meticulous way in which it was prepared. Then at this celebration Christ changed the meaning and purpose of this meal. It is still redemption, but from sin, by which Christ became the sacrificial gift. The messianic liberation is still there, but not in the future, but in the present. Christ proclaims his messianic kingdom right there. The church took this heritage, stripped it from all unnecessary by work and created a liturgy through nearly 2000 years, which we call the Holy Mass, the Eucharist, the Divine Liturgy, or the Mystery of Faith. I think theological and liturgi-

cal meaning of the Eucharist as sacrificial banquet and sacred mystery is beautifully expressed in the "O Sacrum conririium", O Sacred Banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of his passion is renewed, the world is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us. It is all there.

The places where the Eucharist was celebrated were the catacombs, from the basilicas to the Gothic cathedrals, from the exuberance of the baroque to the practical solution in modern churches, each style of our artistic heritage has contributed to the glorification of the Eucharist. Pope John Paul II brought in the concept of enculturation. Each culture should celebrate with expressions of their own cultural roots. So we got in the West, strumming guitars, in Africa the drums accompany the hymns of worship. Gestures native to a culture replace other imported ones.

Still, if we want some kind of unity to express our communion, we have to follow some rules, like in posture, to express this unity. That is why we adhere to the liturgical norms, which the bishop or the Episcopal Conference of a country has laid down. The bishop is the one who ordains or commissions the priests, deacons, liturgical ministers, and not the liturgy committed of a parish.

During this Easter time let us all contribute to the ideal liturgical celebrations. Let us put away our personal preferences and really celebrate communion in one body and one heart.

(The leader now invites the members to spend a few moments in silent reflection as the above text is not meant to be a ready-made answer, but a starter for personal reflection on the theme)

Fraternal Sharing

(The leader now invites the members to share with their Brother Knights any relevant thoughts that came to them during the meditation period.)

Closing Prayer

(Recited by all)

Almighty God, we receive new life from the supper your Son gave us in this world. May we find full contentment in the meal we hope to share in your eternal kingdom. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

I will need six (6) volunteers for each shift period on Friday and Four (4) volunteers for Saturday.

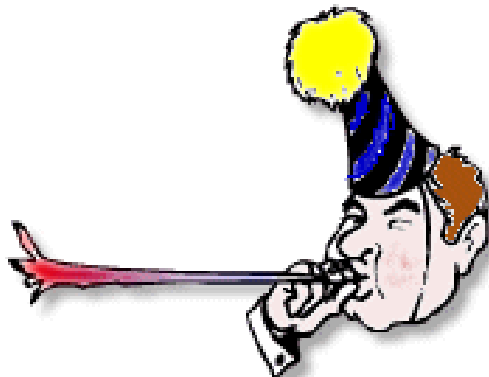

Divine Mercy Hour of Prayer



Our Council is proud to have presented this beautiful prayer service on Tuesday, March 29 at 7:00 PM in St. Bonaventure Church. Fr. Julian was the celebrant and more than 125 Knights, family members, and parishioners participated. On display was a large framed image of Jesus, the State's copy of the Divine Mercy portrait.

The Image of the Divine Mercy

The image of the Divine Mercy originates from a vision that Sister Faustina had in Plock on February 22, 1931. Jesus expressed His desire to have such an image painted with the words beneath it: "Jesus, I trust in You."

Two rays issue forth from His pierced Heart. These two rays signify the Sacraments, and also the Holy Church born of the pierced side of Christ, as well as the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The image then, portrays the great mercy of God, which was fully revealed in the Paschal Mystery of Christ, and is manifested in the Church most effectively through the Holy Sacraments. The purpose of this image is to serve as a vessel for obtaining graces, and to be a sign which is to remind the world of the need to trust in God and to show mercy toward our neighbor. The words found in the signature beneath the image, Jesus, I trust in You, speak of an attitude of trust. "The image," Jesus said, "is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works".

The veneration of this image is based on confident prayer joined with deeds of mercy. Jesus attached the following promises to the veneration of the image thus understood: the grace of salvation, great progress on the road to Christian perfection, the grace of a happy death, and all other graces and temporal blessings which people who practice mercy will ask Him for with trust.

The Feast of Divine Mercy

According to Jesus' wish, the Feast of Mercy is to be celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Jesus is showing us the close connection between the Easter mystery of man's Redemption and this feast. The liturgy for this day extols God most fully in the mystery of His mercy.

The feast of Mercy is to be not only a day designated for the singular worship of God's Mercy, but also a day of grace for all people, particularly for sinners. Jesus attached great promises to this feast, the greatest of which is connected with the reception of Holy Communion on that day. It is the promise of "complete forgiveness of sins and punishment". In other words, this grace is equal only to the one we receive in the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. The greatness of this feast lies also in the fact that everyone, even those who are converted that very day, may obtain any grace for the asking, if what they ask for be compatible with God's will.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy

Jesus dictated the Chaplet of Divine Mercy to Sister Faustina in Vilnius in 1935. In the revelations that followed He disclosed to her its value and efficacy, as well as the promises He attached to it.

In this prayer we are offering the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ to God the Father. We are uniting ourselves with His sacrifice offered on the Cross for the salvation of the world. By offering God the Father His most dearly beloved Son, we are using the most convincing argument with which to be heard. We are asking for mercy for us and for the whole world. The word "us" refers to the person reciting the chaplet and those for whom he desires to offer it or for whom he should pray. The "whole world" indicates all people living on earth and the souls in Purgatory. By praying the words of this chaplet we are performing an act of love toward our neighbor, which along with trust, is the indispensable condition for obtaining graces.

The Hour of Mercy

"As often as you hear the clock strike the third hour, immerse yourself completely in My mercy, adoring and glorifying it; invoke its omnipotence for the whole world, and particularly for poor sinners; for at that moment mercy was opened wide for every soul."

It is Jesus' desire that the moment of His Death on the Cross (3:00 p.m.) be venerated every day; the hour which He said was the hour of grace for the whole world – mercy triumphed over justice. At this hour, He wants us to meditate upon His sorrowful Passion because it reveals most distinctly the love God has for His people. At this time Jesus wants us to worship and glorify the Mercy of God, and, by the merits of His passion, to implore the necessary graces for ourselves and the whole world, especially for sinners.

Spreading the Divine Mercy Devotion

"Souls who spread the honor of My mercy I shield through their entire life as a tender mother her infant, and at the hour of death I will not be a Judge for them, but the Merciful Savior." By these words, Jesus is encouraging us to spread the worship of Divine Mercy; He has promised maternal care to those who do so by shielding them throughout their entire life and at the hour of death.

Note: The above are brief notes taken from a book, Jesus I Trust in You!, Selected Prayers of Blessed Sister Faustina, Boston, MA: Pauline Books and Media, 2nd ed. 1995. St. Faustina was born on August 25, 1905 as Helena Kowalska in Glogowiec, Poland. She was canonized by Pope John Paul 2nd on April 30, 2000.

In a vision to Sister Faustina in 1931, Jesus requested that a portrait of himself be painted as the Lord of Divine Mercy. And that she was to spread this devotion of His Divine Mercy throughout the world. We are invited to adopt this Divine Mercy Devotion into our personal prayer life and as part of our Family Prayer. Jesus, I trust in You!
