Divisions among Christians and the Re-establishing of Unity

Opening Prayer

**In the name of the Father and of the Son and
of the Holy Spirit. Amen.**

The Reading

(to be read by the Leader)

I urge you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose. For it has been reported to me about you, my brothers, by Chloe's people, that there are rivalries among you. I mean that each of you is saying, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Kephas," or "I belong to Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? (Corinthians 1, 10-13)

The Reflection

(to be read by the leader)

Paul gets quite upset with the Corinthians about their factions. It is due to human sinfulness and folly that the power of love, which unifies is weakened

We learn from the reading that divisions took place already in the early church. The other major breaks came from the split of the oriental churches in the 11th century and the western churches at the time of the reformation. Historically we might lay blame on both sides for the schism which occurred, but that means also that we have to work to heal wounds, be forgiving when we are hurt and create a climate of mutual trust which builds bridges to meet the separated sisters and brothers.

God's grace has worked in many individuals and churches to create a new community of love by repentance and forgiveness for the sins of disunity in the past. The church leadership has

released many a document to guide the ecumenical movement. (Unitatis Redintegratio (UR) of Vatican II and Ut unum sint of Pope John Paul II.)

The participation of the Vatican in various activities in the World Council of Churches shows the leadership of the Pontiff (bridge builder) in this endeavour.

As Knights we make endeavours to co-operate on and organize projects with other men's organizations. Let these common activities be more than just a friendly gesture. Let it be the beginning of walking on common ground. Do you know your neighbourhood Churches which are not Catholic? May we reach out like the newborn Christ to all men of good will, to get one step closer to the unity which we all desire.

Meditation Period

(The leader now invites the members to spend a few moments in silent reflection as the above text is not meant to be a ready-made answer but a starter for personal reflection on the theme)

Fraternal Sharing

(The leader now invites the members to share with their Brother Knights any relevant thoughts that came to them during the meditation period.)

Closing Prayer

(Recited by all)

Lord, hear the prayers of your people and bring the hearts of believers together in your praise and in common sorrow for their sins. Heal all divisions among Christians that we may rejoice in the perfect unity of your Church and move together as one to eternal life in your kingdom. We ask this through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Celebrate the Coming of Christ with Family Advent Wreaths



During the Advent season families should spend time together preparing for the approaching celebration of the birth of Christ. An Advent wreath can be a great focal point for family prayers and holiday celebrations.

An Advent wreath is a wreath of laurel, spruce or similar foliage with four candles that are lighted successively in the weeks of Advent to symbolize the light that the birth of Christ brought into the world. Traditionally three of the candles are purple, the color of kings and of penance. A rose-colored candle is used to mark the Third Sunday of Advent as a time to rejoice over the closeness of Christmas and the coming of Christ.

Each day your family should gather around the Advent wreath, generally before the evening meal. The proper number of candles are then lighted and a prayer is said.

The blessing of the Advent wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent. The following prayer can be used:

Leader: Our help is the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

Leader: Let us pray. O God, by whose Word all things are sanctified, pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from Your abundant graces. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The wreath would then be sprinkled with water. The daily candle lighting follows.

FIRST WEEK: The following prayer should be repeated each day during the first week. Before the prayer, the family's youngest child lights the first purple candle.

Leader: Lord, rouse Your power, we pray, and come; that we may deserve by Your protection to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and by your deliverance to be made free from them; You who are God, living and reigning with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, forever and ever.

All: Amen

The candle is allowed to burn during evening meals for the first week.

SECOND WEEK: The prayer that follows is to be repeated each day of the second week. Before the prayer, the oldest child lights the first and second purple candles

Leader: Stir up our hearts, Lord, to make ready the paths of Your only-begotten Son, that through His coming we may become worthy to serve You with purified minds. You who are God, living and reigning.

All: Amen.

The two candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the second week.

THIRD WEEK: The following prayer is to be repeated each day of the third week. Before the prayer, the mother lights the first two purple candles and the pink candle.

Leader: Lord, lend Your ear, we beg, to our prayers, and lighten the darkness of our minds with the grace of Your coming. You who are God, living and reigning.

All: Amen.

The three candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the third week.

FOURTH WEEK: The prayer that follows is to be repeated each day of the fourth week. Before the prayer, the father lights all four candles.

Leader: Lord, rouse Your power, we pray, and come; lend Your great strength to aid us; so that through the help of Your grace and by Your merciful forgiveness, the good which our sins obstruct may be quickly brought to us. You, who are God, living and reigning.

All: Amen.

The four candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the fourth week.

After the fourth week, the penitential season of Advent is over and the time to rejoice is at hand. The Advent wreath is transformed into a Christmas wreath. Ribbon and candles are replaced with red ribbon and long red tapers (to be lighted at breakfast on Christmas morning) and, if desired, other festive decorations can be added.

Make December "Membership Renewal" Month.

All Brothers should have by now received their 2006 Membership Renewal Bill together with a return addressed envelope. One third of the Council have responded already which is greatly appreciated. If you are one of those Brothers who have yet to get around to the task of submitting your dues, please locate that bill and respond to it a.s.a.p. before we all get too busy with Christmas, New Year and those other bigger bills.

Almost two-thirds of your annual dues cover assessments from Chapter, State and Supreme for their operational activities and Council's liability insurance. In order to maintain its "Good Standing" in the Order, Council pays, on behalf of each Brother, these assessments as they come due. Therefore all outstanding and overdue dues are a great financial strain and impediment to Council's ability to help deserving charitable causes.

As was mentioned by the Retention Chairman WDGK Brother Bev Isaacs at the November General Meeting the Executive intends to strictly apply the prescribed annual Membership Billing Procedures. These are, in summary, as follows:

1. Membership Bill - First Notice issued prior to commencement of the billing period January 1.
2. If payment is not received in 30 days, mail the Membership Bill - Second Notice
3. If payment is not received in 30 days from Second Notice,
 - (a) the FS will provide the names, addresses etc and amounts of delinquency for each member in arrears to the Retention Committee
 - (b) the FS will mail "Knight Alert" letter signed By Grand Knight and Trustees.
 - (c) Grand Knight will assign a member of the Retention Committee to make personal contact with the delinquent member. Written report will be made to the Grand Knight.
4. If at the end of the second month of arrearage the member has not paid, a Notice of Intent to Suspend will be issued to the delinquent member signed by the Grand Knight and Financial Secretary with copies to Supreme, State, and the District Deputy.
5. If payment is not made within 60 days of processing of Notice of Intent to Suspend, Council files Form 100 indicating Suspension of the member with Supreme.

Financial hardship preventing a Brother's ability to pay dues do unfortunately arise and the procedures require Council to ensure that in such cases the Brother's membership is maintained. Consequently if you know of any Brother in these circumstances please ensure that this is brought to the Grand Knight's or my attention so that Council can maintain the member's "good standing".
