The Reflection

(to be read by the leader)

This is the time of the year during which we are particularly busy in putting charity into action. Packing and delivering hampers for the needy. Inviting people to the true meaning of Christmas in contests in school and parishes, to pray and celebrate with our families the first event of our salvation.

The Church's charitable activity is truly a manifestation of Divine Love. Christ's love for us is celebrated during the Liturgical year which we have just begun. It continues from his birth to his death, one stream of divine love. He gives up his spirit on the cross so that we can receive his Spirit on Pentecost. On Pentecost the Church was born and steeped into God's personified love, charity becomes a responsibility of the Church. The individual – the local community (parish) the particular church (diocese) – the Church Universal they all must practice love and as it is in community it has to be organized. The early church described itself as "koinonia" - community. And koinonia was practiced in three parts: "kerygma" (preaching by word) "martyria" (profession by blood), "leiturgia" (common prayer) and "diakonia" (SERVICE) spirit filled ministry of word and sacrament supported by charity. These ministries will remain dead if they are not transformed by the Spirit in order that our ministries become a witness to the world of the love of the Father "who wishes to make humanity a single family in his Son...that seeks the integral good of human beings."

Brother Knights during this Advent season let us

all be members of God's family and do good to all.

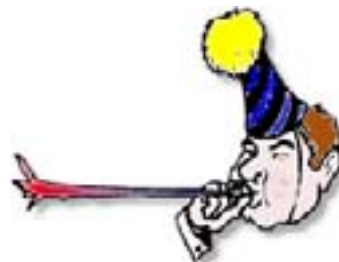

Celebrate the Coming of Christ with Family Advent Wreaths

During the Advent season families should spend time together preparing for the approaching celebration of the birth of Christ. An Advent wreath can be a great focal point for family prayers and holiday celebrations.

An Advent wreath is a wreath of laurel, spruce or similar foliage with four candles that are lighted successively in the weeks of Advent to symbolize the light that the birth of Christ brought into the world. Traditionally three of the candles are purple, the color of kings and of penance. A rose-colored candle is used to mark the Third Sunday of Advent as a time to rejoice over the closeness of Christmas and the coming of Christ.

Each day your family should gather around the Advent wreath, generally before the evening meal. The proper number of candles are then lighted and a prayer is said.

The blessing of the Advent wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent. The following prayer can be used:

Leader: Our help is the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

Leader: Let us pray. O God, by whose Word all things are sanctified, pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from Your abundant graces. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The wreath would then be sprinkled with water. The daily candle lighting follows.

FIRST WEEK: The following prayer should be repeated each day during the first week. Before the prayer, the family's youngest child lights the first purple candle.

Leader: Lord, rouse Your power, we pray, and come; that we may deserve by Your protection to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and by your deliverance to be made free from them; You who are God, living and reigning with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, forever and ever.

All: Amen

The candle is allowed to burn during evening meals for the first week.

SECOND WEEK: The prayer that follows is to be repeated each day of the second week. Before the prayer, the oldest child lights the first and second purple candles

Leader: Stir up our hearts, Lord, to make ready the paths of Your only-begotten Son, that through His coming we may become worthy to serve You with purified minds. You who are God, living and reigning.

All: Amen.

The two candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the second week.

THIRD WEEK: The following prayer is to be repeated each day of the third week. Before the prayer, the mother lights the first two purple candles and the pink candle.

Leader: Lord, lend Your ear, we beg, to our prayers, and lighten the darkness of our minds with the grace of Your coming. You who are God, living and reigning.

All: Amen.

The three candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the third week.

FOURTH WEEK: The prayer that follows is to be repeated each day of the fourth week. Before the prayer, the father lights all four candles.

Leader: Lord, rouse Your power, we pray, and come; lend Your great strength to aid us; so that through the help of Your grace and by Your merciful forgiveness, the good which our sins obstruct may be quickly brought to us. You, who are God, living and reigning.

All: Amen.

The four candles are allowed to burn during the evening meals of the fourth week.

After the fourth week, the penitential season of Advent is over and the time to rejoice is at hand. The Advent wreath is transformed into a Christmas wreath. Ribbon and candles are replaced with red ribbon and long red tapers (to be lighted at breakfast on Christmas morning) and, if desired, other festive decorations can be added.

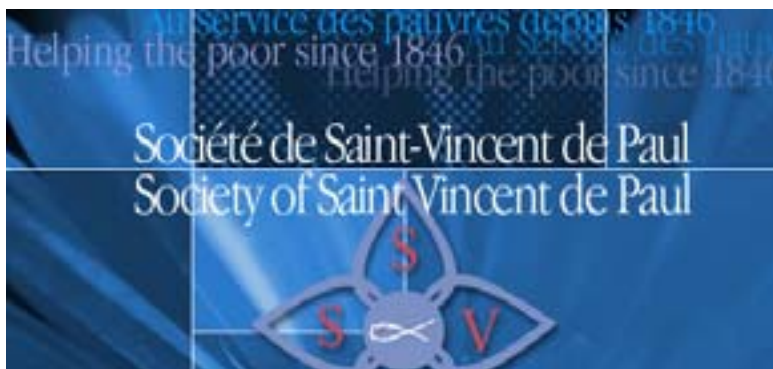
Friday Dec 15th - “Set Up Day”

1. 8am to 9.30am to help assemble the hamper boxes downstairs in the Parish Centre, outside our Columbian Room.
2. 9.30am onwards until about 12noon to help with the unloading and sorting of the groceries from the schools and private donors – St. Francis and St. Anthony rooms.
3. 9.30am to 12 noon – Help put the gifts in the hampers – Parish Centre.
4. 10am to 11.30pm to assist with the unloading of the groceries from IGA – new area of the church basement where the Youth Group hold their meetings.

December is "Membership Renewal" Month.

By the end of the first week of December all Brothers should have received their 2007 Membership Renewal Invoice together with a return addressed envelope. Also enclosed was a second sheet for the Council Survey 2007 and the Individual Member Worksheet 2006 for the Annual Survey of Fraternal Services.

Your quick response to these items will be greatly appreciated and make my job so much easier. The Survey forms will assist me to maintain the Council Data Base with good information that is only used by the Executive for Council matters and the Worksheet will facilitate the completion of the annual report that has to be made to the Supreme Office. Before these items are lost in the hustle and bustle of Christmas and New Year please take a few minutes to fill them in and return them with your dues payment.

Almost two-thirds of your annual dues cover assessments from Chapter, State and Supreme for their operational activities and Council's liability insurance. In order to maintain its "Good Standing" in the Order, Council pays, on behalf of each Brother, these assessments as they come due.

The prescribed annual Membership Billing Procedures are, in summary, as follows:

1. Membership Bill - First Notice issued prior to commencement of the billing period January 1.
2. If payment is not received in 30 days, mail Membership Bill - Second Notice
3. If payment is not received in 30 days from Second Notice,
 - (a) the FS will provide the names, addresses etc and amounts of delinquency for each member in arrears to the Retention Committee
 - (b) the FS will mail "Knight Alert" letter signed By Grand Knight and Trustees.
 - (c) Grand Knight will assign a member of the Retention Committee to make personal contact with the delinquent member. Written report will be made to the Grand Knight.
4. If at the end of the second month of arrearage the member has not paid, a Notice of Intent to Suspend will be issued to the delinquent member signed by the Grand Knight and Financial Secretary with copies to Supreme, State, and the District Deputy.
5. If payment is not made within 60 days of processing of Notice of Intent to Suspend, Council files Form 100 indicating Suspension of the member with Supreme.

Financial hardship preventing a Brother's ability to pay dues do unfortunately arise and the procedures require Council to ensure that in such cases the Brother's membership is maintained. Consequently if you know of any Brother in these circumstances please ensure that this is brought to the Grand Knight's or my attention so that Council can maintain the member's "good standing".



HISTORY OF THE KNIGHTS


The Knights of Columbus was founded in 1882 by a 29-year-old parish priest, Fr. Michael J. McGivney, in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT. Today, more than a century later, the Knights of Columbus has become the largest lay organization in the Catholic Church.

The Order has been called "the strong right arm of the Church," and has been praised by popes, presidents and other world leaders, for support of the Church, programs of evangelization and Catholic education, civic involvement and aid to those in need. Founded during era of anti-Catholic bigotry, the Knights has championed religious rights throughout its 121-year history.

Since it was incorporated on March 29, 1882, the Knights of Columbus has grown from several members in one council to more than 12,000 councils and over 1.6 million members throughout the United States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Panama, the Bahamas, the Virgin Islands, Guatemala, Guam and Saipan.
