## **Interconfessional Marriages**

### *Opening Prayer*

**In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.**

### **The Reading**

*(to be read by the Leader)*

To the rest I say (not the Lord): if any brother has a wife who is an unbeliever, and she is willing to go on living with him, he should not divorce her; and if any woman has a husband who is an unbeliever, and he is willing to go on living with her, she should not divorce her husband. For the unbelieving husband is made holy through his wife, and the unbelieving wife is made holy through the brother. Otherwise your children would be unclean, whereas in fact they are holy.

(1Cor.7, 12-14)

### **The Reflection**

*(to be read by the leader)*

The early church had to deal with unbelievers but thought that their marriages should be accommodated. Today although we have also marriages between unbaptized and Catholics, it is more common that marriages are between Catholics and baptized persons who are not in full communion with the church. The ideal is still that marriages should be between partners who belong to the same denomination. The church is primarily concerned about the indissoluble marital union and the family life that flows from it. Observations show that even different Christian communities do not believe in the dissolubility and accept divorce for whatever reason. Any divorce is detrimental to family life because of the situation of the children. Children have a hard time to accept that they will have basically only one parent where there should be two. Certainly there are legitimate reasons for divorce even in pure Catholic marriages. But there may be also means and ways to eliminate problems without divorce.

The promise of the Catholic partner to raise their children as Catholics may be another point of conflict. Even if the couple has agreed to it before marriage, the reality shows difficulties afterwards.

That the non-Catholic party cannot participate in the sacraments, although today there are some promising practices provided by the new Canon Law, the problem continues. Sometimes the canonical form of a Catholic marriage may be a hindrance, (Canonical form means that a baptized Catholic who has not deserted the faith has to be married for validity before a Catholic priest or deacon.) Sometimes the bishop may free a Catholic from this form so that he or she may be married by a pastor of a different denomination or a civic

official. The Episcopal permission would make this marriage valid.

Even if the marriage is celebrated in the canonical form, a minister of one partner may be invited and read from scripture, give a brief exhortation and bless the couple. The Catholic Church and the Anglican Church (Episcopal in U.S.) have designed a common ritual if a Catholic is with permission married in the Anglican Church.

We have come to the end of our ecumenical year in our formation program. We have only scratched the surface of this tremendous topic. May we be always guided in our ecumenical endeavor by the pillars of our order: Charity, Unity and Fraternity.

At our June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2006 appreciation and wind-up we will celebrate our past Columbian year with fellowship and fun. I would like us to look upon it not only as an opportunity to look back but also as the start to a new and fresh opportunity for our Council. An opportunity to ask the question, where do we as Knights want to go in the upcoming Columbian year. When asking this question lets go much deeper than a simple goal and objective setting exercise.



The February issue of Columbia has an interview by Tim. S. Hickey, titled "A Parish Priest Nothing More... but Nothing Less", of Julie M. Fenster (one of the author's of Parish Priest) in which she describes how our Founder, Father McGivney, led his life with a great sense of balance and peace. It was interesting to read how during his time in the 19<sup>th</sup> century the role of the common man was evolving at a very fast pace. I was however taken back that the most recognized priest in the United States was none other than Father O'Malley. Father McGivney in spite of the thousands of Knights and their families in the United States takes a back seat to a fictional character Bing Crosby played in the movie Going My Way. Many will already have focused in on the obvious: that our Founder did not have the benefit of mass communication as provided by a movie however there are many movies where the character does not endear themselves to such recognition. I think the message of the movie had as much to do with popularization of the character as did the role, or the star, or Love.

"God is Love" is part of our Catholic teachings. Love was certainly at the heart of Father McGivney's living example. I would suggest his was a very practical love that contributed to his sense of balance and peace while motivating him to fight against the injustices and inequities of the day. A love inspired him to do those things we have come to admire while resisting the opportunities, surely there had to be many, to resist the chances to promote or aggrandize himself.

I cannot help but feel today's society, our communities, and our Parish are as complex, if not more so, than those of 19<sup>th</sup> Century America. They had the industrial revolution while we have the technology revolution. It is my opinion the technology revolution is creating more challenging and complex issues, especially within the Catholic faith.

In the "Keys to Success" of our 2005 - 2006 Formation Programme there appears the paragraph "In these days when as Christi-fideles Laici, Knights of Columbus often have to stand up and be counted in discussions on controversial issues regarding faith, morals and common decency." This begs the question what is our faith, our morality and our common decency, and how are we to be counted?

Might I suggest that this is the question we need to address in the new Columbian Year. Let us look towards those things that as a Council and as Knights, we need to change, build upon, or implement, so we as a Council and as Knights meet the challenges of today, with love.

I unfortunately do not recall the person who coined the phrase "Woe to those who seek easy explanations to complex issues". These are complex questions and I would ask you, over the next few weeks to give them considerable thought and then provide me feedback with your concerns, suggestions and thoughts of where this Council should go.

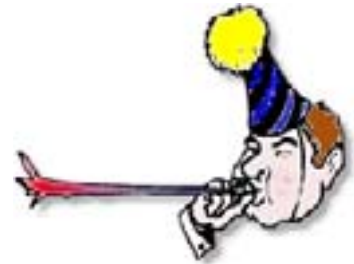

## Second Annual Council Golf Tournament

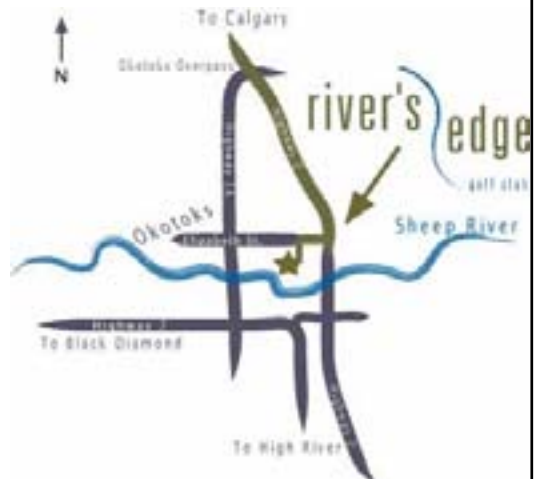
