The Sacrament of Baptism: A Common Basis

Opening Prayer

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Reading

(to be read by the Leader)

While Peter was still speaking these things, the holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. (Acts 10, 44-48)

The Reflection

(to be read by the leader)

Since the beginning of the church we see that the initiation sacraments were given to all believers. In the story of the baptism of Cornelius, the Holy Spirit comes over them even before they are baptized. Cornelius was baptized with his whole household, which included also children and slaves. From the comments of the Jewish Christians we see that they recognized that God's will to save is universal.

The Catholic Church is a sacramental church, the church itself being a sacrament and sign of Christ and a font of grace. It took till the middle ages to recognize seven sacraments and then the churches of the reformation rejected most of the sacraments as ordinances. The Only sacrament which most denominations kept was baptism. To recall shortly our Catholic way of baptism; first everybody even if he or she is not a baptized person, can baptize with the intention to do

what the church does. We baptize with water, which has to touch the person and be accompanied with the words "I baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit".

The Catholic Church recognizes as valid all baptisms which are given this way e.g. Anglican, all Orthodox, Lutheran, United Church etc. For us it makes no difference if a child is baptized in the faith of the parents or adults are baptized demonstrating their own faith. Some denominations accept only adult baptism like many Anabaptist groups like the Hutterites. Some Baptist conferences accept only baptism by the Spirit and reject baptism by water. Here we have already even in baptism a number of different ideas and practices. Nevertheless baptism could be a starting point for a common sacramental praxis. Maybe we should become more aware of our own baptism and practice our baptismal promises in our lifestyle. May this month of Easter celebration renew our life and may our Lady Queen of the May bless you and your families.

(The leader now invites the members to share with their Brother Knights any relevant thoughts that came to them during the meditation period.)

(Recited by all)

Almighty and Eternal God, you keep together those you have united. Look kindly on all who follow Jesus, your son. We are consecrated to you by our common baptism; make us one in the fullness of faith and keep us one in the fellowship of love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

YOUR PARISH NEEDS (WEB) HELP

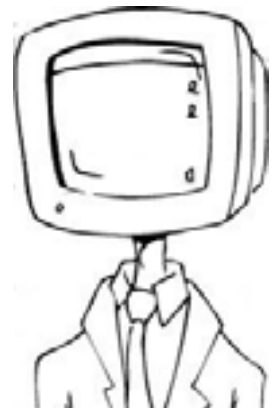

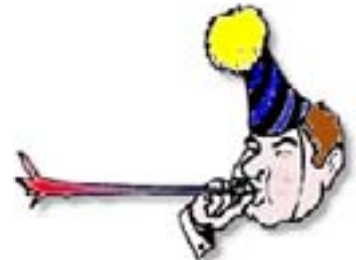

Religious Vocations – Growing in Holiness Together

This is the conclusion of a series of articles on Vocations of relevance to brother knights. It is from “All in the Family”, about how family life can influence young men in answering the call, written by Joseph Pronechen, a Knight who lives in Trumbull, Connecticut and writes for the Catholic press.

“Seminarian Ryan Moravitz, son of Richard and Diana Moravitz, learned from his father’s example of prayer. They both belong to Ely (Minn.) Council 3238.

“I see my dad on a level of prayer that I hope to attain some day,” he said. “He’s a man of prayer, and part of that is being a Knight. Praying the rosary and Eucharistic adoration have always been big things for him. Whenever someone asks me about my dad, I think about how faithful he is to that, and how he encourages me in my own prayer life and growing in holiness.”

His father’s example has paid double benefits. Ryan is studying at the North American College for the Diocese of Duluth, Minnesota., and his brother Brandon has begun studies at Immaculate Heart of Mary (minor) Seminary in Winona.

Their father believes being a Knight has a definite effect on a decision for a religious vocation. “It’s another resource — a spiritual resource through prayer,” he said. “At every meeting we pray for vocations, and every prayer helps.”

In fact, Richard himself is now in his first year of formation for the permanent diaconate.

Ryan says, God willing, he’s looking forward to the day when he will celebrate Mass with his brother concelebrating, and their father assisting as deacon.”

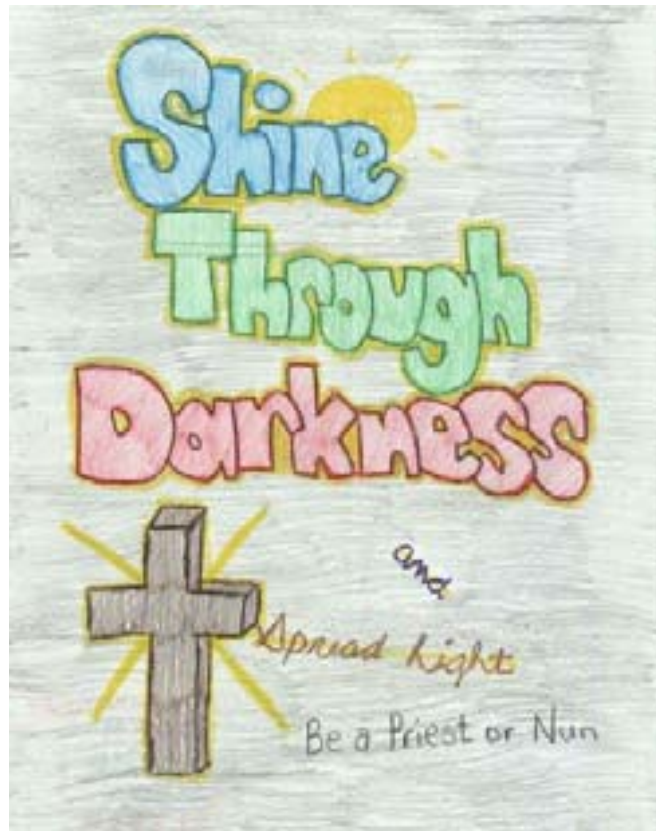

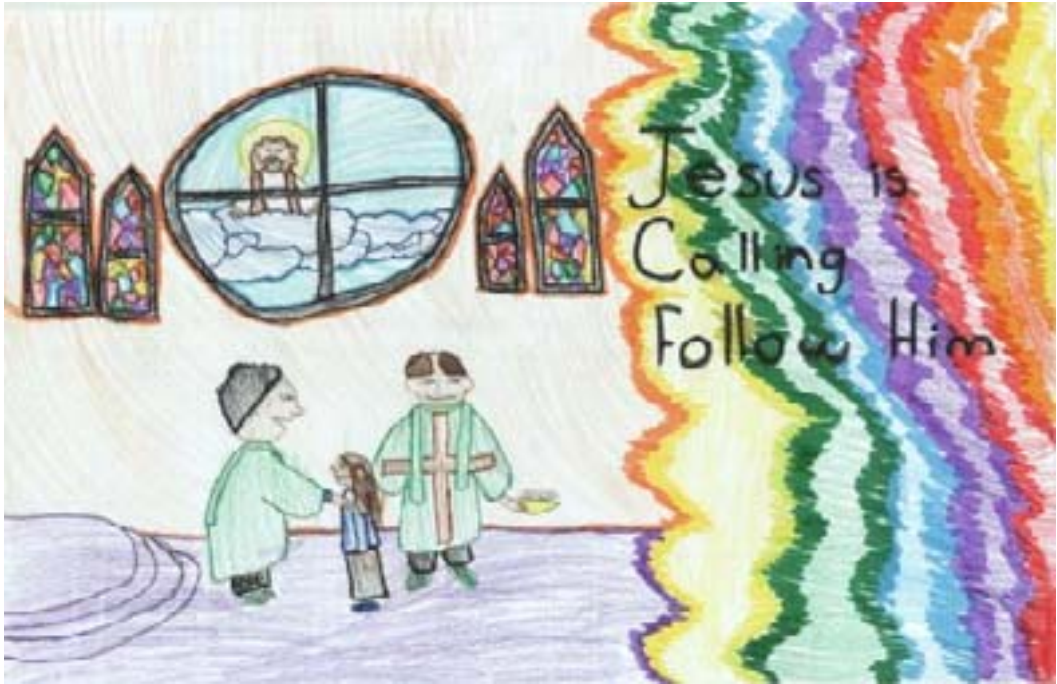

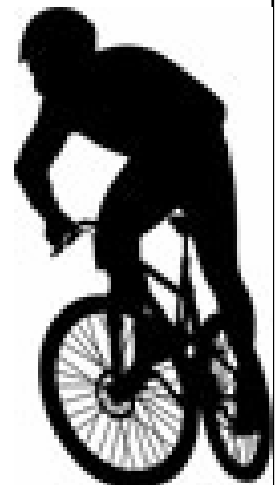
NEW BIKER GANG INVADES CALGARY
