Grand Knight's Message September 2006

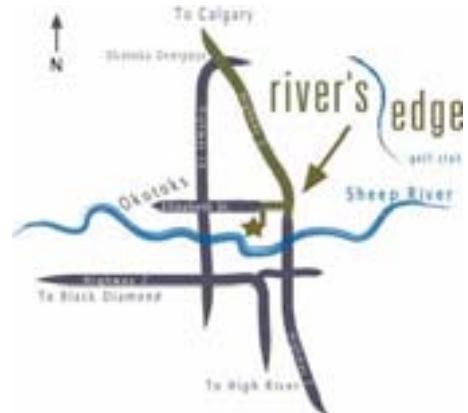

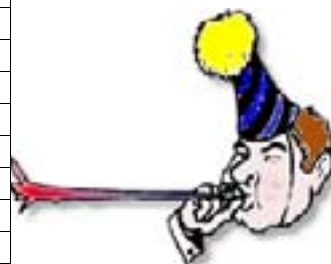

Council 7432 at the Mustard Seed

The Mustard Seed Street Ministry is a “grass roots” Christian, non-profit, humanitarian organization giving a helping hand to destitute people down on their luck and needing the fundamentals of life to survive. We have again committed to preparing and serving meals to the clients. We have two dates booked in this Columbian Year:

**Sunday October 22, 2006
and
Sunday February 11, 2007.**

The meal service hours have been revised. In order to accommodate the programs geared towards the long term residents, lunches will be served to them at noon. Preparations for this meal start at 9 AM and meal service ends at 1:30 PM. Only one meal will be served to the community-at-large, at 4 PM. The meal preparation shift starts at noon until the meal service begins. It will end at 5:30 PM.

Either shift makes for a large sacrifice of time on a Sunday. The earlier shift benefits those seeking to improve their lives. The later shift benefits a larger number of hungry homeless people. I have asked the ‘Seed to sign us up for the noon – 5:30 PM shift on October 22 and the earlier shift 9 AM – 1:30 PM in February.

Please consider volunteering your time on these dates. We need a contingent size of about 8 to 10 persons for preparation and about the same number for serving. The preparation function involves fairly basic kitchen work and the serving function is a whirlwind of dishing out, carrying and bussing activities. You can choose to do either or both functions. It is not difficult work, and they need the help. They have provided us with orientation notes of which I have copies. Knights, friends, spouses and older children are all invited to be part of this corporal work of mercy.

If you come as a family (children 14 years and older), you will experience the joys of a rewarding family experience. You won’t regret it. We are always looking for an ongoing volunteer list because we are doing this on a regular basis, so let me know if you and/or your family members wish to participate.

HISTORY OF THE KNIGHTS

The Knights of Columbus was founded in 1882 by a 29-year-old parish priest, Fr. Michael J. McGivney, in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT. Today, more than a century later, the Knights of Columbus has become the largest lay organization in the Catholic Church.

The Order has been called "the strong right arm of the Church," and has been praised by popes, presidents and other world leaders, for support of the Church, programs of evangelization and Catholic education, civic involvement and aid to those in need. Founded during era of anti-Catholic bigotry, the Knights has championed religious rights throughout its 121-year history.

Since it was incorporated on March 29, 1882, the Knights of Columbus has grown from several members in one council to more than 12,000 councils and over 1.6 million members throughout the United States, Canada, the Philippines, Mexico, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Panama, the Bahamas, the Virgin Islands, Guatemala, Guam and Saipan.
