It would be easy to blame God. But St. Augustine reminds us: “if we could understand him, he would not be God. With Job we cry out to God affirming our faith in his sovereign power. We can be certain: God is our loving Father, even when his silence remains incomprehensible. Hope joins charity even in view of failure. You

love your children but how often are you disappointed in them and how often do you recognize that you have failed them. Renew your hope. The risen Christ has given us new hope, hope even beyond the grave.

Faith tell us through Christ that God is Love and so we come full cycle that only in faith and our belief in the gospel of Christ reveals to us the essence of God which in Christ embraces us all. The final stage of humanity will be the victory of love.

#### **The Reflection**

*(to be read by the leader)*

Before a person is canonized (declared a saint) the church examines how well this person lived the Christian virtues, particularly the divine virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity. Therefore it is small wonder that all the Saints can be examples to us for their practice of charity. The encyclical mentions a few starting with Martin of Tours sharing his coat with a beggar (Christ) to Mother Teresa of Calcutta.

We are no saints, but we are asked to strive for Sanctity. At our baptism we received a Christian name the name of a Saint. I do not know if you celebrate this day, maybe you should find out when your feast day is. In some areas in Europe they do not celebrate birthdays but their names day. Find a description of the life of your Saint and imitate him in his practice of charity. The greatest example of charity after Christ is his mother Mary. From the Annunciation until Pentecost we see her always leaving space for God in her life, following God's loving design by placing herself completely at the service of God. I am the handmaid of the Lord. Everyday the priests and religious say her prayer "My soul magnifies the Lord", which is completely woven from the threads of scripture. Full with the Word of God in scripture she becomes the mother of the Word Incarnate. Under the cross she becomes for us the Supreme Model of love. She offers up Christ and receives John (representative of the church) instead. John in

turn receives Mary as the Mother of the Church. In Mary we see the loving response to God. From her we can learn Charity.

## **Grand Knight's Message**

**May/June 2007**

### **FAREWELL BROTHERS**

No, I am not leaving the council or the parish but of course am leaving the leadership of this great council. As my time as Grand Knight is drawing to a close, I look back with gratitude, satisfaction and humility at the opportunities you have provided me in being involved with the accomplishments of this Council. Gratitude in that through your strengths we were able to meet many challenges, satisfaction for the manner in which these challenges were met and the ever present humility that the talents, strengths and fortunes that we were able to draw on, to accomplish this, are gifts from our Lord. I do not mean to diminish the efforts, sacrifices and hard work expended by each and every one of us but only bring to mind our own good fortunes.



I am confident and delighted with the incoming leadership, first class Catholic Gentlemen, all. Confident our council will grow and prosper; delighted as to the enthusiasm they bring to the leadership. I believe it is the enthusiasm demonstrated by the Leadership of any organization which determines its success and leads to increasing membership. Norman Vincent Peale wrote: "enthusiasm is no Pollyannish, sweetness and light, bright and fortune concept. It is a strong, rugged mental attitude that is hard to achieve, difficult to maintain but powerful-so powerful!" The word enthusiasm from the Greek entheos means God in you or full of God.

This begs the question what is our faith, our morality and our common decency and how are we to be counted? Our leadership will be charged with how will the Council be counted as a whole while providing for individuality.

We are now getting to the point that as Knights it is possible that our different beliefs can cause us to seek different destinations. I am not suggesting that we all must seek to belief in the same manner or take the same path but simply as Catholic gentlemen we ought to be travelling to the same general destination. As a Catholic I believe God made us for his own purposes and we should keep ourselves in good 'moral repair'. Morality seems to consist of three parts. First is harmonious relationships and fair play. The second is the well being of the individual and the third is the general purpose of life. . The first is as acceptable as motherhood and apple pie, for who would argue with being honest, kind and helpful to one another. It is natural to begin there however unless we progress to the second – our moral health within – we are only deceiving ourselves. If the old adage, is true that you cannot make men good by law, then follows that goodness must come from within. Does it not then follow the opportunities to demonstrate the goodness will benefit not only the individual but also the community?

Is this not what the Knights are all about and if our Council does not provide us the path to the same general destination, are we a fraternal order? These are complex questions to which the leadership will need your thoughts, concerns, suggestions and feedback. I encourage all Brothers to actively support them.


