**June 2008 Meeting  
Jesus' Identity**

**Opening Prayer**

**In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.**

**The Reading** *(read by the Leader)*

When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John. Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many. (Mark 10, 41-45)

**The Reflection** *(read by the leader)*

Christ often called himself the son of man and one wonders what that really means. We have no trouble if he is called the Son of God, but this Son of man? We find this expression first in the Old Testament in the visions of Daniel. After the beasts "with the clouds of heaven there came one like a son of man. And to him was given dominion (Daniel 7:13) A new kingdom dawns, the beasts are changed by the son of man who makes them human, a new humanity. Jesus could certainly build on this image of Daniel. Jesus, the son of man, is also the Great Judge and here again he becomes the poor and downtrodden - humanity who is either helped or not by the people to be judged "*What you did to them you did to me.*" Jesus and the Judge are the same. The suffering Jesus is the same who comes in glory. The kenosis (self emptying) of the son of God to the son of man reverses itself in his resurrection and returns to glory. After he became man he brought true humanity into the world. Jesus is God and man - two natures in one person. So we come through the scriptures to the dogmatic statement of the creed "*We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God.... For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven and was made **Man***" and we have asked many questions. We might pose many more. We have used the guidance of the Holy Father as to how he has tackled that question as a Catholic and a theologian. But we have to give our own answer, as Catholic men, as Knights of Columbus, as married or single men, as lay, priest or religious. Who do you say I am? I hope through these meditations that our love and friendship with Christ, true God and true man is renewed and strengthened. I hope through actions as friends of Christ, we change the world of strife to a world of peace: the kingdom of God. Vivat Jesus!

**Meditation Period**

*(The leader now invites the members to spend a few moments in silent reflection as the above text is not meant to be a ready-made answer but a starter for personal reflection on the theme)*

**Fraternal Sharing**

*(The leader now invites the members to share with their Brother Knights any relevant thoughts that came to them during the meditation period.)*

**Closing Prayer** *(Recited by all) Let us pray together*

Lord our God, all truth is from you, and you alone bring oneness of heart. Give your people the joy of hearing your word in every sound and of longing for your presence more than for life itself. May the attractions of a changing world serve only to bring us the peace of your kingdom which this world does not give. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen

## ***Reflection and Prayer for the Eucharistic Journey***

June 2008

### **Eucharist as Mission for the Life of the World**

Our participation in Sunday Eucharist is not for ourselves alone. We are fed with the Word of God, and we eat the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, so that we may become the hands and the feet and the voice and the face of Christ for the world. "By her very mission, 'the church ... travels the same journey as all humanity and shares the same earthly lot with the world: she is to be a leaven and, as it were, the soul of human society in its renewal by Christ and transformation into the family of God'." ### **REFLECTION QUESTIONS**

1. In my daily life, am I living as a disciple? Do I give witness to God's love and goodness through my actions and my words?
2. What world situation do I find most distressing? How can work with other believers to make a difference?

### **FAMILY ACTIVITIES**

Listen to the Sunday scriptures together, and name some possible ways to be a little bit of leaven in the world this week. Keep a family journal about what happens.

Watch the news together: look for signs of the presence of God, and consider how the followers of Jesus can make a difference in real-life situations.

you yearn to draw all people to you,  
to fill them with your holy Spirit of peace and love.  
Make this holy Eucharist bear fruit in us,

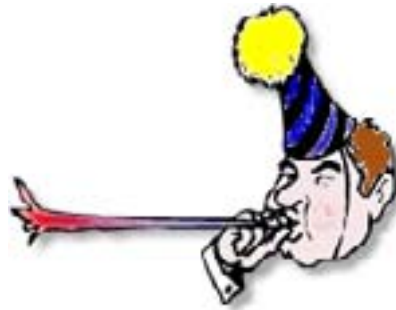
