Jesus the Beloved son of the Father

Opening Prayer

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Reading *(read by the Leader)*

After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; then from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them. (Mark 9, 2-8)

The Reflection *(read by the leader)*

Six days later, ie. after Peter's answer as to the identity of Christ, which we considered last September as the opening reflection. Now six days later the Transfiguration. In between Jesus had told them about his passion and that discipleship meant losing one's life. Experts have speculated that Peter's confession and the transfiguration might have coincided with the Jewish Feast of Atonement and the Feast of Tabernacles. On the Feast of Atonement (Yom Kippur) the high priest would pronounce God's name Yahweh which was usually read as Adoni, the Lord. This certainly would give new meaning to Peter's confession of Jesus being the Christ, connecting the Feast of Tabernacles with the transfiguration, would explain Peter's words "*Let us build three dwellings.*" To connect the life of Christ with the calendar of the Jewish festivals is quite acceptable, because they are always mentioned in the Gospels. The place is a mountain, like Mt. Sinai where God appears to Moses. Here Jesus appears in his glorified state while at prayer. People have noticed that when they look at people in prayer they look different. The law and the prophets represented by Moses and Elijah indicate that the whole history and life of the people of Israel leads up to Christ: who will suffer, die and be resurrected for the fulfillment of all of Israel's expectations. The disciples, although they feel good, are at the same time terrified. Like Moses, who speaks with God and builds the Tent in which God lives in a cloud. Maybe Peter wanted the Lord to live in this new tent, to be always present. Then comes God's voice "*This is my beloved Son, Listen to him.*" Do we listen for God's beloved son? Would we not rather listen to the voices of others, or our own voices? Do we expect the fulfillment of the world from Jesus or have we given up on his kingdom? Let us try to answer for ourselves all these questions and recognize that we too have become the beloved children of the Father.

Meditation Period

(The leader now invites the members to spend a few moments in silent reflection as the above text is not meant to be a ready-made answer but a starter for personal reflection on the theme)

Fraternal Sharing

(The leader now invites the members to share with their Brother Knights any relevant thoughts that came to them during the meditation period.)

Closing Prayer *(Recited by all) Let us pray together*

Father of light, in you is found no shadow of change but only the fullness of life and limitless truth. Open our hearts for the voice of your word and free us from the original darkness that shadows our vision. Restore our sight that we may look upon your Son who calls us to change of heart for he lives with you forever and ever. Amen

Reflection and Prayer for the Eucharistic Journey

May 2008

Eucharist as Resurrection

The liturgical scholar Mark Searle once said that Eucharist could only be understood by those who had already died. The terminally ill can often teach us about what really matters in living. Can these two things be connected? The Eucharist is the right and privilege of the baptized, those who, in the words of St. Paul have died and gone into the tomb with Christ.

Perhaps it is true: The Eucharist can only be understood by those who have died — died to the "stuff" of this world, whether that be the material stuff or the stuff of our divisions, bigotries and attitudes. Eucharist is about new life, a life beyond all that "stuff." This is why Eucharist is central to the keeping of Sunday, the Day of the Resurrection.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. How do we keep Sunday in our family? Is Eucharist the centerpiece of Sunday for us?
2. What do we do in our house after Mass? Is this day truly different from the other days of the week?
3. Can I think of one or two things I can cut out or let go of on Sunday to allow it to be more a day of rest and re-creation?

FAMILY ACTIVITY

Let Sunday be Sunday. Keep the Eucharistic fast until after Mass and break the fast with a fine family meal on Sunday. Make sure that all sit at table for this meal—no TV on, no one sitting in another room—all in table fellowship.

Let us pray for the salvation of the world and for the needs of the Church.*

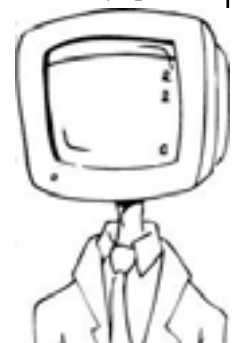

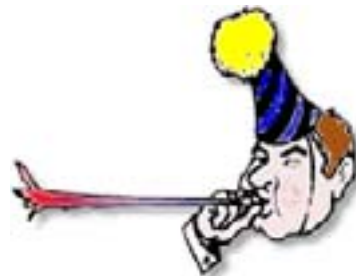
